

This document is a translation of the Regulations of the Doctoral Student Self-Government of Wrocław University of Science and Technology of 3 August 2021 into English. The Polish version of the Regulations is the binding version, and the purpose of the translation of this document is to enable foreign PhD students to understand the provisions contained therein.

Chapter I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

§ 1

Participants of the doctoral studies and students of the doctoral school, hereinafter referred to collectively as doctoral students, shall constitute the Doctoral Student Self-Government of Wrocław University of Science and Technology, hereinafter referred to as the Self-Government.

§ 2

The Self-Government operates on the basis of the Act of 20 July 2018, Law on Higher Education and Science, hereinafter referred to as the Act, the Act of 3 July 2018, Introductory Provisions of the Act, Law on Higher Education and Science, hereinafter referred to as the Introductory Provisions, these Regulations and in accordance with the Statute of Wrocław University of Science and Technology.

§ 3

The activities of the Self-Government and the procedures for the election of doctoral student representatives to the electoral bodies, authorities and collegiate bodies of the University, in accordance with the Statute of Wrocław University of Science and Technology, are laid down in these Regulations.

§ 4

The Self-Government shall:

- 1) uphold the rights of doctoral students;
- 2) express the opinions of the doctoral student community;
- 3) represent and promote the doctoral student community;
- 4) participate in the deliberations and activities of the collegiate bodies of the University in accordance with the rules laid down in the Act and the internal regulations of the University;
- 5) participate in decision-making in matters concerning doctoral students;
- 6) support, promote and implement scientific, cultural and social activities of doctoral students;
- 7) take care to improve the quality of education of doctoral studies and doctoral school;
- 8) carry out other activities laid down in the Act and other legal regulations, the Statutes and internal regulations of the University and these Regulations.

Chapter II

SELF-GOVERNMENT BODIES

§ 5

The Self-Government carries out its tasks through the activities of the Self-Government Bodies, which include:

- 1) The University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students;
- 2) The Council of Doctoral Students, hereinafter referred to as the Council;
- 3) The President of the Self-Government, who is also the Chair of the Council of Doctoral Students, hereafter referred to as the Chair;
- 4) Faculty Assembly of Doctoral Students;
- 5) Collegial Body of Doctoral Students;
- 6) Doctoral Student Assembly of the Dormitory Residents.

§ 6

The bodies of the Self-Government may establish cooperation with national and international organisations with the same or similar objectives, particularly with the National Representation of Doctoral Students.

§ 7

The bodies of the Self-Government adopt resolutions by a simple majority of votes, unless the provisions of the Regulations state otherwise.

§ 8

Representatives of the Self-Government are members of the University Senate, College of Electors, Doctoral School Council, Faculty Councils, as well as other bodies appointed on the basis of universally binding or internal regulations.

Chapter III

UNIVERSITY-WIDE ASSEMBLY OF DOCTORAL STUDENTS

§ 9

The General Assembly of Doctoral Students is an assembly of all doctoral students and is the supreme decision-making body of the Self-Government.

§ 10

The date of the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students is set by the Council or, if there is no Council, by the Doctoral Student's Collegial Body, and is made public by announcement on the appropriate website of the Council of Doctoral Students in the domain pwr.edu.pl and by sending information electronically, no later than 12 days before the date.

§ 11

The University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students is valid regardless of the number of doctoral students present.

§ 12

The competence of the General Assembly of Doctoral Students shall include:

- 1) adopting the Regulations of the Doctoral Student Self-Government;
- 2) electing members of the Council;
- 3) adopting a resolution on the dismissal of a member of the Council.

PROCEDURE FOR THE ELECTION OF COUNCIL MEMBERS

§ 13

The procedure for the election of Council members, carried out by the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students, shall be as follows:

- 1) the election shall be ordered and conducted by the outgoing Council;
- 2) the election shall be held by 31 October of the academic year in which the term of office of the body ends;
- 3) all members of the Self-Government shall have the active and passive right to vote, subject to § 16 sec. 2;
- 4) a candidate shall be proposed to the Council in writing on an application form (appendix no. 1 to these Regulations) together with the candidate's consent, at the time and place specified by the Council in the election announcement, not later than three days before the date of the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students. In the event that the required number of nominations has not been submitted by the aforementioned deadline, candidates may be proposed during the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students;
- 5) the Council publishes the list of the candidates on the appropriate website of the Council of Doctoral Students in the domain pwr.edu.pl, however not later than two days before the date of the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students;
- 6) the meeting is chaired by the Chair of the Assembly, elected in an open vote by the majority of votes, from among those present at the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students. In connection with this function, the Chair of the Assembly is not entitled to the right to vote in other elections held by the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students;
- 7) members of the Self-Government present at the University-Wide Doctoral Student Assembly shall elect, in an open vote, a Secretary of the Assembly and a ballot committee consisting of at least three members. Due to their function, members of the ballot committee and the Secretary of the Assembly are not entitled to passive voting rights in other elections held during the meeting;
- 8) members of the Self-Government present at the University-Wide Doctoral Student Assembly elect their candidates in a secret ballot from among the proposed candidates listed in alphabetical order;

- 9) on the ballot paper, members of the Self-Government place an 'X' next to the name of their preferred candidate or candidates, respectively. A vote is valid if on the ballot paper the voter puts an 'X' next to the number of candidates not exceeding the number of mandates. A vote is invalid if it has been cast on a ballot paper other than a ballot paper, if it has been torn, if it has been annotated and if an 'X' has been placed next to the number of candidates exceeding the number of mandates. A model ballot paper constitutes Appendix No. 2 to these Regulations;
- 10) in a vote conducted using electronic means of communication on a voting form received electronically, the members of the Self-Government fill in the form in the manner described therein, which should ensure that the vote will be accepted by the voting system and thus deemed valid if sent within the time period allocated for voting;
- 11) the candidates who have received the highest number of votes shall be elected, provided that if two or more candidates have received the same number of votes, an additional round of elections shall be held with the participation of those candidates provided that at least one doctoral student from each educational path should be elected.

§ 14

1. A resolution to dismiss a member of the Council may be passed by the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students convened at the request of the Council on its initiative or on the basis of a written request to the Council from at least 30 members of the Self-Government. The motion must contain a justification. Voting on the resolution shall be conducted by secret ballot.
2. A resolution referred to in section 1 should be immediately presented by the Council to the appropriate bodies, committees and other bodies of the University to which a member of the Council has been delegated by the Council.

§ 15

1. The grounds for a motion for dismissal of a member of the Council, adopted by a resolution by an absolute majority of votes, shall be failure to perform or improper performance of the duties of a representative in a given body, in particular:
 - 1) unjustified absence of the representative from three meetings of the Council;
 - 2) the representative's action that grossly violates the interests of Wrocław University of Science and Technology or the Self-Government.
2. The dismissal of a member of the Council is not tantamount to his/her dismissal from the bodies and committees in which he/she participates, unless it follows from the content of the resolution.

§ 16

1. The expiry of the mandate of a member of the Council shall take place as a result of:
 - 1) loss of doctoral student status;
 - 2) written resignation of a member of the Council;
 - 3) valid conviction for an intentional offence;
 - 4) being punished with a disciplinary penalty;
 - 5) acquiring membership in a political party.
2. A person who meets the following requirements may be a member of the Council:
 - 1) has not been punished with a disciplinary penalty;

- 2) has not been convicted of an intentional offence by a valid court judgement;
- 3) is not a member of a political party or election committee.

§ 17

The provisions of § 13 shall apply accordingly to by-elections. By-elections shall be held as soon as a vacancy arises.

Chapter IV

THE COUNCIL OF DOCTORAL STUDENTS

§ 18

The Council is composed of seven members of the Self-Government, elected at the General Assembly of Doctoral Students.

§ 19

1. The term of office of the Council shall be one year, commencing on 8 November and continuing until 7 November.
2. Elections to the Council shall be held each year in October.
3. Within 30 days of the election of the Council, the members of the Council of the outgoing term of office have a duty to support its new members. The members of the Council of the outgoing term of office have a duty to invite its new members to the meetings of the Council, from the date of election of the Council until the end of the outgoing term of office.

§ 20

1. The competences and duties of the Council shall include:
 - 1) exclusive representation of all doctoral students of the University and their interests;
 - 2) defining the guidelines for the activities of the Self-Government;
 - 3) passing resolutions on all matters which are the subject of activity of the Self-Government and which are not reserved for the competence of other bodies of the Self-Government;
 - 4) giving its opinion on the matters of doctoral students, in particular on the educational programme, at the request of the University authorities;
 - 5) co-operating with the University authorities and the organisational units of the University in measures aimed at improving the educational system and the financial situation of doctoral students;
 - 6) agreeing, with the relevant bodies of the University, on the appointment of the Dean and Deputy Deans of the doctoral school;
 - 7) agreeing on the regulations of a doctoral school with the relevant bodies of the University;
 - 8) agreeing with the relevant bodies of the University on the rules for granting benefits from the University's funds in the scope allocated for doctoral students, in particular the rules for granting scholarships from the University's own fund for scholarships;

- 9) deciding, together with the relevant bodies of the University, on the distribution of funds allocated by the University's authorities for doctoral students' matters and preparing a report on the distribution of such funds at least once every academic year and making it available on the website of the University's Public Information Bulletin;
 - 10) conducting activities in the area of doctoral student affairs, including social and living, cultural, integration and scientific matters of doctoral students and supporting external initiative in this area;
 - 11) convening the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students by decision of the Council or at the request of at least 30 members of the Self-Government; the announcement of the date of the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students should be made within one week of the receipt of the request;
 - 12) convening of Faculty Assemblies of Doctoral Students by the decision of the Council, at the request of a representative of doctoral students in the Faculty Council or at the request of at least 20% of the members of the Self-Government of a given faculty; the date of a Faculty Assembly of Doctoral Students should be announced within a week of the receipt of the request;
 - 13) convening a meeting of the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students;
 - 14) keeping a register of doctoral students' representatives in the bodies and bodies of the University referred to in § 8;
 - 15) preparing a report on the annual activity, which shall be published on the website of the Council no later than two days before the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students, during which the elections of the Council members are held, and presenting it no later than at this University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students;
 - 16) archiving documentation related to the activities of the Council;
 - 17) conducting information activities, in particular, concerning changes;
 - 18) in the legal regulations applicable to doctoral students;
 - 19) delegating doctoral students' representatives to the bodies of the University, in accordance with the competences specified in the internal regulations of the University and not reserved for other bodies, and to non-academic bodies associating doctoral students;
 - 20) appointing (also by competition) and dismissing representatives of the Council to perform specific tasks;
 - 21) preparing draft Regulations of the Doctoral Student Self-Government;
 - 22) adopting, by an absolute majority of votes, a resolution on a protest action or strike;
 - 23) carrying out other activities laid down in the Act and executive acts.
2. Where the activities of the Council concern the matters of a given faculty or academic discipline, the Council shall be obliged to consult a representative of doctoral students in the Council of that faculty who represents the relevant academic discipline. The representative of doctoral students in the Faculty Council shall present an opinion, in the form indicated by the Council, within seven days.

§ 21

The Council's areas of activity include:

- 1) cultural – organizing, supporting and promoting cultural activities of doctoral students, including organization of sports events and integration meetings, cooperation with external cultural organizations, e.g. theatre, opera and other activities ensuring participation of doctoral students in the cultural life of the University and the city;

- 2) social – working out the rules for granting benefits from the University’s resources to doctoral students; taking part in the work of the committees involved in awarding scholarships, prizes and distinctions to doctoral students; giving opinions on documents concerning social matters of doctoral students;
- 3) teaching – preparing opinions on teaching issues, including giving opinions on documents concerning teaching issues;
- 4) scientific – preparing trainings for the scientific development of doctoral students, conducting information activities with regard to grants and funds for the scientific activity of doctoral students;
- 5) financial – participating in committees related to matters of distribution of funds allocated by the University authorities for doctoral purposes; advising doctoral students on preparing applications for funding of doctoral activities at the University;
- 6) statutory – preparing opinions on matters concerning the organisation and course of doctoral school, scholarships awarded to doctoral students, and preparing opinions on decisions, decisions and actions of the University authorities concerning doctoral students’ matters; conducting information activities, in particular concerning changes in legal regulations relating to doctoral students.

§ 22

1. The Council shall be headed by the Chair, whose powers shall include:
 - 1) representing the Self-Government and the Council towards the authorities of the University and other entities of the academic community, as well as towards local and state authorities and administrative bodies;
 - 2) chairing and directing the work of the Council;
 - 3) convening meetings of the Council;
 - 4) supervising the Council’s budget;
 - 5) supervising the work of the Council members;
 - 6) implementing the resolutions and opinions of the Council and resolutions of the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students
 - 7) expressing opinions on matters concerning doctoral students, independently of other bodies of the Self-Government;
 - 8) cooperating with the bodies of the University in matters falling within the scope of activity of the Self-Government.
2. The Vice-Chair of the Council shall be responsible for supporting the activities of the Chair. In the absence of the Chair, they shall be replaced by a Vice-Chair indicated by them, or in the absence of such an indication, by the oldest Vice-Chair. The Vice-Chair shall act on the basis of a written power of attorney.
3. The Secretary of the Council shall be responsible for preparing and archiving documentation related to the activities of the Council, including the drafting of draft resolutions of the Council and minutes of the Council’s meetings; keeping a record of the representatives of doctoral students in the bodies and committees of the University referred to in § 8; and taking measures to fill any vacancies that occur.

§ 23

1. The first meeting of the new Council shall be convened under the responsibility of a Council member elected with the highest number of votes obtained at the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students, and in the event of a tie, the alphabetical order shall be decisive. The date and place of the meeting must be fixed in consultation with each member of the new Council and announced one week before the date of the meeting. This date may be shortened with the agreement of all members of the new Council.
2. The members of the Council shall elect from among themselves a Chair, at most two Vice-Chairs and a Secretary by secret ballot with a simple majority. In the absence of a conclusive vote, the candidate with the higher number of votes obtained at the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students shall become the Chair.

§ 24

The Council acts on the basis of the Regulations of the Doctoral Students' Council adopted by it.

§ 25

The competent body of the Doctoral Student Self-Government referred to in separate regulations shall be understood as the Council.

Chapter V

FACULTY ASSEMBLY OF DOCTORAL STUDENTS

§ 26

The Faculty Assembly of Doctoral Students is a meeting of all the members of the Self-Government of a given faculty. The members of the Faculty Self-Government shall be understood as doctoral students enrolled in doctoral programmes at a given faculty and doctoral students enrolled in a doctoral school whose supervisor or assistant supervisor (if all supervisors are employed outside the University) is employed at the Faculty.

§ 27

The date of the Faculty Assembly of Doctoral Students shall be set by the Council and made public by announcing it on the relevant website of the Council of Doctoral Students in the domain pwr.edu.pl and sending information by e-mail, no later than 12 days before the date.

§ 28

The Faculty Assembly of Doctoral Students shall be valid irrespective of the number of members of the Self-Government who participate in it.

§ 29

1. The competences of the Faculty Assembly of Doctoral Students shall include:
 - 1) election of doctoral students' representatives to the Faculty Council;
 - 2) election of a doctoral student representative to the Council of Doctoral Students (a doctoral student is elected to the Council of Doctoral Students from among the representatives of doctoral students elected to the Faculty Council, who obtained the highest number of votes in the election to the Council; § 30 point 6 shall apply accordingly);
 - 3) election of a doctoral student representative to the Disciplinary Committee for Doctoral Students and a doctoral student representative to the Disciplinary Appeal Committee for Doctoral Students.
2. The number of doctoral students' mandates to the Faculty Council for the next term shall be determined by the Council, in consultation with the current representatives of doctoral students on the Faculty Council, in accordance with the Statute of Wrocław University of Science and Technology.

§ 30

ELECTION PROCEDURE

The procedure for elections by the Faculty Assembly of Doctoral Students:

- 1) the election of doctoral students' representatives to the Faculty Council and the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students and others shall be initiated by the Council;
- 2) elections should be held by August 31 of the academic year in which the term of office of the Faculty Council or Collegial Body of Doctoral Students expires; in the event of failure to elect representatives to the Faculty Council or Collegial Body of Doctoral Students within the deadline referred to above, subsequent elections shall be ordered by the Council at the request of a representative of doctoral students in the Faculty Council or at the request of at least 20% of the members of the Self-Government of a given faculty;
- 3) all members of the Faculty Self-Government shall have the active and passive right to vote, subject to § 16 sec. 2;
- 4) the provisions of § 13 points 4-10 shall apply accordingly to a Faculty Assembly of Doctoral Students, with the exception that the members of the Self-Government shall elect a ballot committee consisting of at least two persons;
- 5) a member of the Council may participate in the meeting without the right to vote;
- 6) the candidates who received the largest number of votes shall be elected, provided that if two or more candidates receive the same number of votes, an additional election round shall be held with the participation of those candidates.

§ 31

1. The terms of office of doctoral students' representatives on the Faculty Council and the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students shall be two years, with the reservation that they may not exceed one half and the end of the term of office of the Senate of the University.

2. In the event of the expiry of the mandate of a doctoral student representative on the Faculty Council, the provisions of § 16 shall apply accordingly. A by-election of doctoral student representatives on the Faculty Council shall be held immediately, for a period until the end of the ongoing term of office commenced by the representative whose mandate expires.

§ 32

1. A resolution on the dismissal of a member of a body or a representative of the Self-Government may be adopted by a Faculty Assembly of Doctoral Students convened at the request of the Council on its initiative or based on a written request of at least 20% of the members of the Self-Government of a given faculty. Voting on the resolution shall be conducted by secret ballot.
2. The aforementioned resolution should be immediately presented by the Council to the relevant bodies, committees and other bodies of the University.
3. The provisions laid down in § 16 shall apply accordingly to the expiry of the mandate of a doctoral student representative.
4. In the case of a doctoral student representative to the Faculty Council, the expiry of the mandate shall also occur as a result of unexcused absence from three meetings of the Faculty Council, in the event of an inability to attend such meetings for a period exceeding six months, or in the event of failure to comply with the obligations referred to in § 33.

§ 33

The duties of a doctoral student representative to the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students from among the doctoral student representatives elected to the Faculty Council include in particular:

- 1) submitting a report on its annual activities in the form and by the date specified by the Council;
- 2) taking part in the work of the admissions committee in a given discipline, which evaluates candidates for the doctoral school, at the request of the Dean or the head of the discipline of education;
- 3) supporting the activities of the Council with regard to didactics (especially with regard to proposing new courses for doctoral students) in the form and timeframe determined by the Council;
- 4) appointing doctoral students' representatives to other committees and bodies at the Faculty appointed on the basis of the University's internal regulations and not reserved for the competence of other bodies of the Self-Government.

§ 34

The provisions of § 30 shall apply accordingly to by-elections. By-elections shall be held as soon as a vacancy arises.

Chapter VI

COLLEGIAL BODY OF DOCTORAL STUDENTS

§ 35

The Collegial Body of Doctoral Students is an assembly of the representatives of doctoral students in the Faculty Councils (one representative from each Faculty) and the members of the Council (seven representatives).

§ 36

1. The competences of the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students shall include:
 - 1) electing a representative of doctoral students to the University Senate;
 - 2) electing a representative of doctoral students to the College of Electors;
 - 3) adopting a resolution to dismiss the representatives of doctoral students elected by the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students;
 - 4) convening the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students in the absence of the Council.
2. The term of office of doctoral students' representatives in the University Senate and the College of Electors shall be 2 years, with the reservation that it may not exceed half and the end of the term of office of the University Senate and the College of Electors respectively.
3. In the case of the expiry of the mandate of doctoral students' representatives in the Senate of the University or the College of Electors, the provisions of § 16 shall apply accordingly. A by-election for doctoral students' representatives in the Senate of the University or the College of Electors shall be held without delay, for the period until the end of the current term of office commenced by the representative whose mandate expires.

§ 37

The date of the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students meeting is set by the Council and is made public by announcement on the appropriate website of the Doctoral Council in the domain pwr.edu.pl and by sending a message by e-mail to the members of the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students, no later than 12 days before the date.

§ 38

A meeting of the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students is valid when at least half of its members are present.

§ 39

Procedure for elections conducted by the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students:

- 1) the elections shall be ordered by the Council and conducted by the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students;
- 2) the elections shall be conducted in accordance with the schedule of elections in the University announced by the University Election Commission;

- 3) the members of the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students present at the meeting have the active right to vote. If a member of the Council is also a representative of doctoral students in the Faculty Council, they are entitled to one vote. The passive electoral right is vested in all members of the Self-Government, subject to § 16 sec. 2;
- 4) the provisions of § 13 points 4-10 shall apply accordingly to the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students;
- 5) the candidates who have received the largest number of votes shall be elected, with the reservation that if two or more candidates have received the same number of votes, an additional election round shall be held with the participation of those candidates.

§ 40

The representative of doctoral students in the University Senate elected by the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students is required to submit a report to the Council on its annual activities in the form and by the date specified by the Council.

§ 41

1. A resolution on the dismissal of a doctoral student's representative in the University Senate and the Electoral Collegial Body may be adopted by the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students at the request of the Council acting on its own initiative or at the written request of at least four members of the Collegial Body of Doctoral Students. Voting on the resolution shall be conducted by secret ballot.
2. A resolution on the dismissal of a doctoral student's representative in the University Senate and the Electoral Collegial Body should be immediately presented by the Council to the relevant bodies of the University.

§ 42

1. The mandate of a doctoral student representative in the Senate of the University and the Electoral Collegial Body shall be terminated in the cases referred to in § 16.
2. In the case of a doctoral student representative in the Senate of the University, the cause of dismissal may also be failure to fulfil the obligation to submit an annual report referred to in § 40.

§ 43

The provisions of § 39 shall apply accordingly to by-elections. By-elections shall be held as soon as a vacancy occurs.

Chapter VII

DOCTORAL STUDENT ASSEMBLY OF DORMITORY RESIDENTS

§ 44

The Doctoral Student Assembly of Dormitory Residents is a meeting of all members of the Self-Government residing in the Dormitories.

§ 45

The Doctoral Student Assembly of Dormitory Residents acts on the basis of its own Regulations approved by the Council of Doctoral Students.

Chapter VIII

FINAL PROVISIONS

§ 46

1. The Regulations and amendments thereto shall be adopted by the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students by a majority of at least 2/3 of the votes present at the University-Wide Assembly of Doctoral Students.
2. These Regulations shall enter into force upon the Rector's confirmation of their compliance with the Act and the Statute of the University.
3. The terms of office of members of the university-wide, faculty and doctoral student self-government bodies elected before the entry into force of these Regulations shall remain unchanged.
4. Meetings of the Doctoral Student Self-Government bodies may be conducted using electronic means of communication, ensuring in particular:
 - 1) real-time transmission of the meeting between the participants,
 - 2) real-time multilateral communication whereby the participants of a meeting may express themselves in the course of the meeting- while maintaining safety conditions.

Chapter IX

TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

§ 47

1. From 1 October 2019 until 31 December 2023, in accordance with Article 296 of the Act of 3 July 2018, Introductory Provisions of the Act – Law on Higher Education and Science, the Doctoral Student Self-Government shall be constituted by doctoral students referred to in Article 215(1) of the Act and participants of doctoral studies referred to in Article 279(1) of the Introductory Provisions. Therefore, the Council, for the period indicated above, must include at least one student of the doctoral school (as referred to in Article 215(1) of the Act) and at least one participant of the doctoral studies (as referred to in Article 279(1) of the Introductory Provisions).
2. In the academic year 2019/2020, a maximum of three mandates to the Council shall be allocated for students of the doctoral school. In the academic year 2020/2021, students of the doctoral school shall have a maximum of four mandates in the Council, and participants of the doctoral studies shall have a maximum of five mandates. In the academic year 2021/2022, students of the doctoral school shall have a maximum of five mandates in the Council and participants of the doctoral studies a maximum of four mandates. In the academic year 2022/2023, a maximum of three mandates in the composition of the Council shall be allocated for participants of the doctoral studies.
3. The existing representatives of doctoral students to the Faculty Consultative Councils shall become representatives of doctoral students to the Faculty Councils.
4. In accordance with the University Statutes, until Faculty Councils established under the existing regulations are appointed, the Faculty Consultative Councils shall retain their powers and function according to the existing rules. The vacancies of doctoral students' representatives to the Faculty Consultative Councils shall be filled on the basis of the existing regulations, no later than by 30 September 2021.
5. These Regulations shall enter into force on 1 September 2021, subject to § 46 sec. 2.
